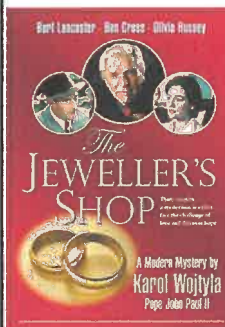
## Pentecost Sunday

Pentecost Sunday—the coming of the Holy Spirit—is a solemn Feast Day of our Church and our Parish. It is also the birthday of our Catholic Church, the family of the people of God. It is well to remember that the Church was born in frailty and weakness. The early Christians had no property, no buildings, or money. (Something like our parish at one time.) Their only resource was good people, few in number. But that left room for the power and authority of God to work powerfully through them. The Holy Spirit came into their lives, and the change was dramatic. It is well to remember that while the action of the Holy Spirit in our lives is mysterious, it's not some kind of magic. What is called for from us is openness, willingness, and effort in responding to and cultivating the Holy Spirit's gifts.

Come Holy Spirit and enkindle in us  
the fire of your love, joy, peace,  
patience, kindness, goodness, gentleness  
and self-control.

## What's happening concerning plans to reopen our Catholic churches in the Diocese of Yakima, in particular, in Benton County?

Bishop Tyson is now consulting with area Deans and Pastors to review and implement the protocols for reopening our parishes—guidelines developed by the Bishops of Washington State and the Washington State Catholic Conference (WSCC).

Our church and all of our parish facilities still must remain closed until we receive the “go ahead” to reopen from Governor Inslee and from Bishop Tyson. During our celebration of indoor daily and Sunday live-streamed Masses, we are still limited to a maximum number of 10 people present in the church. Everyone present in the church is exercising some kind of liturgical role during the celebration of Mass (such as clergy, lector, musician, cantor, acolyte, videographer, etc.).

Benton County is still in Phase I of Governor Inslee's reopening plan. As outlined in a directive he issued on May 27th, churches in Phase I are now allowed to hold services outdoors with a maximum of 100 individuals in attendance. While this is certainly good news, there are many requirements—too many to mention here—which need to be satisfied before we can celebrate Masses outdoors. Each parish must submit a “readiness plan” with Bishop Tyson before it receives his approval for celebrating outdoor Masses. We just found out about this requirement on the evening of Thursday, May 28th. I am working together with Christ the King Parish and St. Joseph's Parish so that we can establish a common date (a Sunday) when we will all begin our outdoor Sunday Masses.

Until we can meet again for public worship, either outdoors or indoors, please keep joining us for our live-streamed Masses. We're glad that you're praying and worshipping with us online. Thank you for your patience during these challenging times.

[A reminder ... What may be happening at the Catholic parish in Pasco does not pertain to any of the parishes of the Diocese of Yakima—including Richland and Kennewick. Pasco is part of a different diocese—the Diocese of Spokane—and is part of Franklin County (not Benton County); so the Catholic parish in Pasco may be operating under different rules than us.]

# Things You Can Do to Celebrate Pentecost

The annual celebration of Pentecost should be an opportunity to begin or renew our commitment to the mission we've been given as God's children. How? Here are some ways to celebrate the feast of Pentecost, and grow more aware of the work of the Spirit in your life and in the world.

- 1. Find out your Confirmation date.** Pope Francis encourages us to discover our Baptism date and celebrate this moment in time when we became part of Christ's church and were freed from original sin. In the same way, shouldn't we celebrate the day we chose to embrace our faith of our own free will, and to be commissioned and sent out to tell everyone the good news? The sacrament of Confirmation is a one-time event, with lifetime effects. Read up on the saint you chose as your patron. Reach out and pray with your Confirmation sponsor if he or she is available, or if not, pray for them, and try to make it to mass or adoration on the date. Tell the Holy Spirit "thank you," for coming to you as Gift and Advocate.
- 2. Re-familiarize yourself with the gifts of the Holy Spirit:** wisdom, understanding, piety (reverence), knowledge, counsel (right judgment), fortitude (courage), and fear of the Lord (wonder and awe). Ask the Holy Spirit to help you sift through your own charisms and gifts, and for guidance on what God's will is for you in building up the body of Christ.
- 3. Ask the Holy Spirit to guide you through an examination of conscience** and prepare yourself to receive the sacrament of Penance. The further we are from sin, the closer we are to each person of the Trinity.
- 4. Help renew the face of the earth.** We are the body of Christ, and each of us is a vessel of the Holy Spirit. When the Apostles received the gift of the Spirit at Pentecost, they went out and spoke about their faith, about the man they loved and knew to be the Christ. They no longer feared proclaiming their beliefs. They shared what they had, what they knew, with everyone they encountered. Go out and share your faith with someone. Invite someone back. Be not afraid to speak.
- 5. Gladden the Holy Spirit.** Spend some time serving God by serving others. Perform either corporal or spiritual works of mercy in your home and/or community. Pray a prayer to the Holy Spirit.
- 6. Spend some time thanking the Trinity.** One of the easiest ways to do this is by taking up your rosary and simply saying, "Thank you, God the Father" on all of the beads. Then, "Thank you, Jesus Christ, the Son" all the way around the rosary, and finally, "Thank you, Holy Spirit" through all of the beads. Do this as part of Adoration if possible. It is hard not to feel overwhelmed with gratitude by the time you finish the exercise.

Have a great Feast of Pentecost!

**Do you know someone in West Kennewick who needs help making ends meet?** The St. Vincent de Paul Conference at Holy Spirit may be able to help. We assist with rent, utilities, food, gas and more. Our Helpline number is 509-591-0632.

**Economic Relief for Our Parish Due to COVID-19:**

These are stressful economic times for all of us—individuals, families, and businesses large and small; including the Parish of the Holy Spirit. I want to let everyone know that we (the Parish) have applied for all of the economic relief grants that are available to us at this time; both from the Federal Government and from Catholic Charities and the Diocese of Yakima. They include ...

The COVID-19 Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL)—which is an emergency program of the Small Business Administration, which offers small businesses (like ours) grants up to \$10,000.

The Paycheck Protection Program (PPP)—which is also a program of the Small Business Administration (SBA), which offers 2½ months of payroll protection to small businesses who keep all of their employees hired during this time of pandemic. **Update:** On April 28, 2020, our parish received an email from our local bank that the SBA has approved our grant request. On May 5, \$55,700 was deposited directly into our parish checking account to cover parish payroll for 2 1/2 months.

Catholic Relief Services Rice Bowl Grant—which offers grants up to \$1,000 to parishes to assist with local outreach efforts to those in immediate need (of food, clothing, utilities, etc.).

Catholic Charities *Light of Hope* Grant—which offers grants up to \$1,000 to parishes to assist those who are affected economically by the COVID-19 virus. **Update:** On May 21st we applied for a second *Light of Hope Grant* which Catholic Charities is offering to our parishes. Our request for a grant in the amount of \$1,000 was approved! We will be using this grant to assist those affected by the virus through our St. Vincent De Paul Conference.

Diocese of Yakima Communications Grant—which offers grants up to \$500 to parishes to provide technology designed to keep parishioners engaged with the spiritual life; particularly when our physical churches need to remain closed. **We have received this grant already ... in the full amount!** We are using it to provide our live-streaming services of Masses and other devotions, and to engage with our parishioners through Flocknotes, our parish website, Zoom meetings, and other forms of social media. **Update:** On May 13, 2020 our parish received a **second Communications Grant from the Diocese of Yakima - in the amount of \$500!**

## Look What Blew into Town

**D**id it really happen the way the story is told? Who would not give anything to have been there? But maybe we *have* been there. Maybe we have met people who were so open to the mysterious power of the Spirit of God that they were able to accomplish things they never thought they could. Maybe at times even we, too, have been so moved by that mysterious Spirit. Is it possible that we are mistaken about what is truly mysterious or Spirit-driven? Is it possible that we fail to see the mystery of God in everyday life?

This is not to say that nothing extraordinary happened on that Pentecost day. It certainly did! People who kept a low profile out of fear of facing the same deadly fate as their leader seemed to rush out onto the street and proclaim that leader's mighty acts. What has happened to them? How is such a reversal of behavior to be described? It happens that when something wondrous occurs we often use exaggerated images and superlative language in an attempt to capture the astounding character of the event. To embellish language does not mean that the event was not amazing. It means that it was so amazing that we are at a loss to describe or explain it. We are, after all, talking about the dynamic Spirit of God that can completely change people. This is the same Spirit we received at baptism. Are we open to have it change us?

# Dear Padre,

**I look forward to every Pentecost Sunday, when I am renewed in God's spirit. Recently I read an article that said the Holy Spirit is a she. Is the Holy Spirit female?**

**T**he third person of the Trinity is the Holy Spirit. The word *spirit* is a translation of the Hebrew word *ruah*, which can mean "breath," "air," or "wind." This is the wind that God first sent to create the world, it is the breath that God breathed into Adam and Eve, and it is the tongues of fire that the apostles experienced on the first Pentecost.

In Hebrew, the word used for the Holy Spirit is feminine. In Greek, the word used is neuter, and in Latin, the word used is masculine. Not surprisingly, this caused a few problems for the early Church, which included many Hebrew, Greek, and Latin speakers. In areas where Hebrew or another Semitic language, such as Syriac, was spoken, the Holy Spirit was thought of as feminine, and so images of the Holy Spirit as mother were common. These various images of the Holy Spirit were openly expressed until about the fourth century, when Latin took over as the dominant language in the West.

We believe that in the life of the Trinity, God the Creator begets the Son. The expression of the love between God and the Son is the Holy Spirit. Perhaps we shouldn't think of the Holy Spirit as being either gender. Saint John describes the Holy Spirit as being God's love (see 1 John 4:7-13).

On this Pentecost and always, I wish you God's Spirit of love.
